Prior to this period it was known indifferently by the names of Terra Australis, Austral Asia, or New Holland, according to the whim of the explorer or the historian. The first statutory recognition by the Imperial Parliament of the name Australia occurs in the Act 10 Geo. IV, c. 22, which refers to Western Australia on the western coast of New Holland. To understand the principle of the Australian Federation, it is necessary briefly to trace the creation and growth of the various States which comprise the Commonwealth and their constitutional development.
